#### Spring Fling is a Fun Day for All!

On Sunday, April 29, we held our first Spring Fling Showcase, which was a rousing success by any measure! We wanted to introduce the programs and services we have available for children and adults with a wide range of physical and emotional challenges. The event drew 160 visitors who took part in a carnival-themed day at our farm in Swisher. Twenty-four youngsters participated in a 15-minute Try-A-Ride, for those considering taking adaptive therapeutic riding classes. Over the course of the day, 50 people attended Horse101 Demonstrations, which introduced the basics of a horse's body parts and how to approach and where to stand safely. During the day-long festivities, a Mix-n-Mingle provided an opportunity to meet with our hippotherapy partners and staff while engaging in craft activities and participating in carnival-themed games. Along with our staff and board members, 25 volunteers helped make the day happen. Chuck Deisbeck, CEO, South Slope, our premiere sponsor, was on hand with his family to pitch in, and local basketball star Megan Gustafson became our tallest side-walker ever! #### Miracles hosts two field trips in April

In April, Miracles in Motion had the pleasure of hosting two field trips: The Good Earth Nature-Based Education Center (Solon, Iowa) and Prairie Hill Elementary (Cedar Rapids, Iowa). The Good Earth brought 8 students, one teacher, one volunteer, and two parents. While students from Mrs. Rairden and Mrs. Olson's rooms totaled 15 students, 2 teachers, 8 paras, and 2 parents.

The typical field trip runs approximately 2 1/2 hours which includes a sack lunch (provided by student attending field trip). Our curriculum, as deemed age appropriate, for field trips include:

How to be safe around horses.

Horse behavior and anatomy.

Horse breeds and colors.

Horse keeping - diet, health, care, etc.

Hands on grooming station

Horse themed games and exploration inside the sensory trail

Access to the picnic area and sensory trail.


