I know that the past 30 days have not been easy, nor is what has been asked of you. I have been there with many of you, and I see the time you put in and your dedication.

We had air quality issues--who would have imagined cancelling classes due to the wildfire smoke?-but still, chores happened. Then we had extreme heat ... and for lowa, it was extreme. Again we had to cancel classes, but not chores.

Chores are in the early morning and the mid-afternoon. You arrive at the barn, focused on taking care of the herd, giving them fresh hay and grain, making sure the waterers are cleaned, the horses groomed, fly spray and fly boots and fly masks back on.
