We have 18 horses—the best horses anyone could ask for, and yes I am biased! We are located on a 77-acre farm outside of Swisher, Iowa (some ask, "where?"). We are a Therapeutic Equestrian Center ("what's that?").

Our mission is to foster personal achievement by providing diverse equestrian activities with therapeutic, educational, and recreational benefits for persons with disabilities. We believe in the joy of bringing people and horses together by nurturing strengths and celebrating success. Many achievements may be small, but for our riders they may be major milestones—and what a feeling to be a part of that.

We are always looking for volunteers to join in this experience. Volunteers' hard work every day allows Miracles to fulfill our mission each year.
