This includes checking that the pastures, stalls, barn, and arenas are maintained in safe, clean, and healthy conditions for the herd, staff, and volunteers. Also—as anyone who has horses knows—checking, repairing, and building fences is a full-time job in itself! The property manager checks the horses daily for cuts and general health, making an emergency call to the vet when a horse is sick or injured. They are responsible for chores, feed, supplements, medications, bedding, cleaning the barn, preparing the center for winter and then in turn for spring. Tasks include coordinating any outside maintenance that might be needed.

**Nick Andeway** has done all this for the past six years at Miracles, through many firsts. First was the COVID pandemic, learning the word "derecho," seeing the new lobby to the indoor arena built, adding new shelters for the horses, enclosing the pavilion, redoing the lane to the

center, tiling projects, planting new trees, the new Busse Barn complex, and so much more. At the end of August we said good-bye and a heartfelt thank-you to Nick as he embarks on a journey traveling the United States.
